# Sail Melbourne Report for GC December 2023

### **Background**

RBYC held Sail Melbourne in January 2023, and Australian Sailing was keen to gain the club's commitment to hosting it on an ongoing basis. Sailing Committee and General Committee agreed this would not be feasible as doing so in January would overly restrict opportunities to hold other regattas including State, Nationals and World Championships. In Feb 2023 it was agreed with Australian Sailing to hold Sail Melbourne in late November/ early December instead of January. Sailing Committee, GC and the GM agreed this would be good timing as it would not compromise the January regatta window and be early enough not to impact the busy Christmas period.

The regatta was considered highly successful by competitors, volunteers, Australian Sailing and the Club. This report provides a summary of the event as well as plans for the 2024 event.

#### **Summary of the Event**

Sail Melbourne was held at RBYC from 30 December – 3 December. This was a four-day regatta while previous Sail Melbourne's had been 5 days.

Regatta Chair was Paul Pascoe and Principal Race Officer was Peter Osbourne, both RBYC members. Race Officers and volunteers were sourced from other clubs, chiefly Black Rock, Sorrento and Mordialloc. Several RBYC members donated boats and volunteer time. There was an International Jury with 3 overseas judges and 3 Australian judges.

There were three courses at RBYC and one at Sorrento for the Waszps. The RBYC courses were;

- Bravo Course (ILCA 4,6,7) Course Race Officer Kevin Wilson. Mainly resourced by RBYC volunteers.
- Charlie Course (470's, Tasars, 2.4s, Opti's) Course Race Officer Gary Hosie with a team mainly from Mordialloc
- Delta Course (Kites foils and IQFoils) Course Race officer Ross Wilson with a team mainly from Black Rock.

Here are some statistics about the event;

- Number of Entries 170
- Number of Athletes 193
- Number of volunteers over the 4 days approx. 200
- Number of Countries 11
- Number of entrants from outside of Victoria approx. 100
- Number of Races 118

All racing was held as scheduled despite some challenging conditions.

A Race Management Seminar was held on Thursday evening, with presentations by sailors as well as race officials.

The awards presentation was hosted by RBYC with participation from Australian Sailing and the Race Officers.

At the end of the regatta competitors, officials and volunteers were thanked and feedback was requested. There was also a debrief with Race Officials and Australian Sailing.

#### Assessment of Event

Feedback from Competitors

- Great Racing good courses
- The four-day event worked well
- The December timing was suitable
- Friendly welcoming club it was clear the whole club was behind the event
- Great videos and photos on Facebook (from Beau Otteridge)
- Some difficulties with car parking and Trailer Parking but not insurmountable

# Feedback from Race Officials and Volunteers

- Race management boats were suitable overall with some issues on the first day, which were corrected.
- Communication (with competitors and with race management teams) was good overall but there were some areas for improvement for next year
- Volunteers were very well looked after (good lunches, great to have choice, great to have the Bayview room as the radio room)

# What are the benefits for the club?

Over the years some members, while acknowledging the event has been successful from the perspective of the competitors, have questioned the value to the club itself (as so many of the competitors are not club members and probably never will be). It is an inconvenience to members (losing their carpark for the duration of the event) and a lot of work for staff and volunteers, and it is reasonable to ask the question "How does Sail Melbourne benefit the club"?

#### Observed benefits are as follows;

- A successful Sail Melbourne is a boost for classes already at the club (especially Lasers, Optis and 2.4, but applicable to most of the classes at this year's event).
- The event is an opportunity for members to "show off" their club people who are proud of their club are more likely to remain as members and attract other members.
- The opportunity for club members to watch the best and meet sailing teams from all over the world (Olympians, ex-Olympians, coaches, support teams)
- The opportunity for our race management team to learn from the best and meet volunteers from other clubs
- The event attracts new volunteers who are more likely to continue as club volunteers
- The atmosphere at the club was enjoyed by sailors and non-sailors alike.

Overall the event made a modest profit, about the same as would have been made if functions had been held on those days. The main benefits of the event are not financial but more long lasting as described above.

# Plans for next year

It is recommended (pending agreement by all parties) that Sail Melbourne be held from Thursday 28 Nov – Sunday 1 Dec., with Paul Pascoe as the Regatta Chair and Peter Osbourne as PRO.

Endorsement is requested from General Committee.
